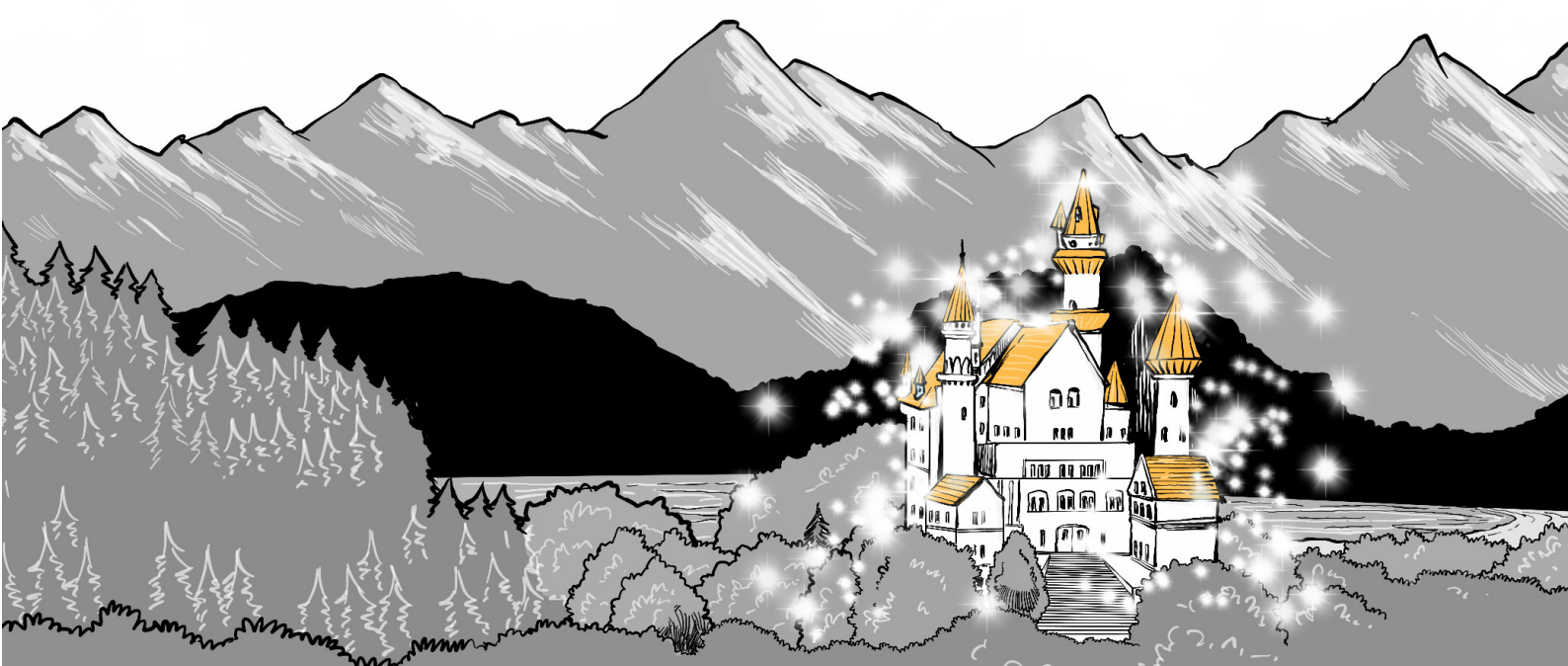


Hidden Messages
